Walton EMC prepares next generation electricians

To improve their electrical wiring skills, FFA members from area high schools recently competed in the Sub-Region Electrification Career Development Event (CDE) at Walton EMC's Monroe headquarters. The purpose of the CDE is to prepare students for an electrical career in the agriculture field.

Cody Dalton and Haden Haslett of Oconee County FFA earned first and second place honors respectively at the event. Sean Stovall of Morgan County FFA placed third. Dalton and Stovall went on to compete at the North Region CDE.

The CDE includes a wiring problem in which participants translate a wiring diagram, select the necessary wiring materials for the problem and then install a complete electric circuit. They must

also answer questions based on their understanding of the National Electric Code and explain the components of an electrical wiring task before a panel of judges.

Walton EMC partners with the Georgia Department of Education to sponsor the Electrification CDE. FFA is a national organization of high school agricultural education students.

To prepare for the CDE, students participated in agricultural mechanics classroom training courses and afterschool programs.

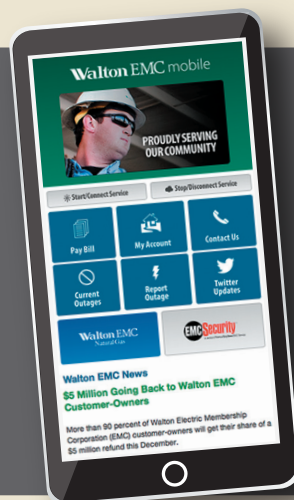
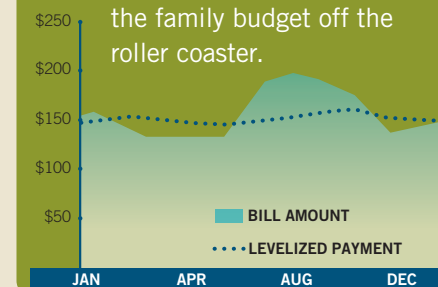
COMBINED BILLING
