The Georgia Agriculture Tax Exemption (GATE) card is a certificate issued by the Georgia Department of Agriculture that identifies its user as a gualified farmer or producer who is exempt from sales tax on the inputs used in the production of their commodity.

If you are currently receiving a GATE sales tax exemption for services from Walton EMC,

your card will expire on Dec. 31, 2015. To continue receiving this exemption, you need to



re-apply for the GATE certificate and submit it no later than Dec. 31, 2015. Copies of your renewed GATE
