The four-story, 650,000-square-foot warehouse is Amazon's largest facility in the metro Atlanta area. It sits on a 93-acre site in South Gwinnett County near Highway 78.

... A Holiday Tradition

Lighting Snellville's Christmas Tree


Every year on the Saturday after Thanksgiving, thousands gather at Snellville's Towne Green for a festive ceremony to light the community Christmas tree. The tradition signals the official start of the holidays for many Gwinnett County families.

"It's like a guiding light for the community — a beacon for the holidays," Snellville Mayor Barbara Bender said about the dazzling display that is powered by electricity from Walton EMC.

The first official tree lighting ceremony occurred in 1982. Former city council member Elise Cotter is credited with organizing the event.

The attraction brings many families to the city's Towne Green throughout the holiday season.

"We see people at the tree making photos almost every day, so I think it must appear in a lot of Christmas cards," said Kelly McAloon, executive director of Experience Snellville, the city's tourism and trade promoter.



FUN FACTS

- The 30-foot artificial tree is built from panels attached to a cone-shaped metal frame.
- It's decorated with 3,500 5-watt LED lights, 75 feet of poinsettia garland and about 200 ornaments. A 3-foot illuminated star tops the tree.
- · It takes two days for employees of the Snellville Public Works Department to erect the tree.
- The tree lights shine from 5:30 p.m. to 7 a.m. daily.
- The tree was given a makeover and relocated to its highly visible spot on the Snellville Towne Green 12 years ago. The space is outfitted with electrical outlets to accommodate the tree's power needs.
- Each brilliant C7 LED bulb consumes only .07 kilowatt hours of electricity to operate for 13 ½ hours daily. The same amount of energy will power a toaster long enough to brown two slices of bread.
- The tree lighting ceremony is the finale to the town's annual Christmas parade.
- It lights up daily daily through Jan. 1, 2022.
